ORDER GRANTING MUTUAL DISCOVERY
MISDEMEANOR CASES ONLY

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that defense counsel be allowed to examine copies of the following:

1. All statements known to the police and prosecutor of all endorsed witnesses;
2. All statements of the defendant, which statements are recorded or have been reduced to writing;
3. The investigator's report and all preliminary complaint reports (PCR's) concerning the above-captioned case;
4. All scientific and laboratory reports;
5. All corporeal and photographic lineup sheets.

In addition, defense counsel in the above-captioned case shall be permitted to view:

1. All photographs, diagrams and/or other visual evidence, including videotapes, which pertains to this case and which are in the custody of the police department.
2. All physical and/or tangible evidence in the custody of the police department which pertains to this case.

Discovery in this case is mutual, and counsel for the prosecution shall be permitted to view all statements, reports, photographs, diagrams and other visual and audio evidence, including videotapes and audio tapes, as well as physical and/or tangible evidence which Defendant and/or his/her counsel intends to use at trial.

Counsel in this case is retained/assigned and any photocopies made under this Order shall be at the expense of the attorney.

The victim's address, employer or other personal identification are excluded as part of this Discovery Order.
