Each cemetery is aligned in North/South rows and labeled alphabetically, reading East/West or West/East.

All readable epitaphs are included. Errors are inevitable and regrettable.

Western Wayne County Genealogical Society dedicates this record to member Joan Lemieux who passed away in December 1999.

Livonia Center Cemetery, located on Farmington Road about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile south of Five Mile Road in Livonia, MI, was read in the late summer and fall 1999 by Charlotte Mitchell, Margaret Harris, Yvonne Wake, and Helen Sigler Smith. It is one of the early cemeteries in Western Wayne County and is presently owned by the City of Livonia and maintained by the Department of Public Service. In view of the many grave-sites of 100 to 150 years, Livonia Center Cemetery is also lacking a historical marker.

This cemetery was previously read by the DAR 1975 and Detroit Society for Genealogical Research 1976. Any effort to record the past, whether in the form of community history, biographies, or cemetery readings, is a tremendous undertaking primarily from voluntary sources. Livonia Center Cemetery

Read from center drive on the south side east to west by row and dividing the South side (oldest) from the North side. The committee chose to give each row a letter, each grave a number, although many times unmarked spaces are in between. Many family plots were originally marked by low-level cement divisions, some of which have become overgrown with grass so as to be visible only upon close examination and indentation of the soil. A few of these plots take up more than one row and are designated as such in this record. The committee also chose to give conditions and type of stone when needed for identifying purposes, and different spellings of names within the same families are also included.

Many stones give the death date only, with year, month, and days of age. It has been chosen to present this in the form of the birth date followed by the death date. A perpetual calendar is helpful in determining as closely as possible the birthdate. Epitaphs are included when readable, some partial readings appear.
